Community Art Camp (3 years - 9 grade)

Free Community Art Camp! Every summer, kids ages 3 years to 9th grade come from all over Compton to dance, sing, draw, paint and have fun for 5 days. *Empowering and exposing students to critical thinking, collaboration, and creative problem solving in the arts.*

Little Creators (0-4 years)

Free Sensory Play Activities, Monthly Meet-Ups for our littlest students & their guardian, and Monthly Virtual Parent Connection Classes. *Empowering and exposing early learners and their parents/guardians to motor skill development and creative problem solving through sensory play and exploration.*



Compton Mural Project (7-12 graders)

Journeying with a cohort of 25 youth through a 3 month process of learning about Compton history, the importance of civic engagement, what social justice can look like, building confidence using our voices, and mural design. *Empowering and exposing Compton youth to civic engagement & social justice through mural design and conversation.*



EDUCATION

Houses of STEAM Education Program (K-6 graders & family)

Compton youth, K-6th, and their families learn STEAM education through hands-on training, building projects, attending field trips and speaking with BIPOC professionals in the STEAM career fields. *Empowering and improving students' proficiency in STEAM-related subjects.*



STEAM Tech Camp (6-9 graders)

Summer Day Camp preparing Compton students for STEAM careers in digital media, coding, robotics, sound & music production, 3D printing, and hands-on experiences through creative engineering (makerspaces). *Empowering and improving students' proficiency in STEAM-related subjects.*



DiscoverU Enrichment Center (2-8 graders)

This is a safe afterschool space focused on discovery, connection and enrichment for 2-8 graders in Compton. Starting March 5th, 2024. Monday-Thursday / 3-6:30pm

Pathways Program

Upon high school graduation, students have the choice to enroll in college, train for a career and/or become an entrepreneur. Compton Youth Career Pathways (8-11 graders)

The CYCP provides job, career and trade development for youth ages 14-24 through job shadowing, community service and internships.





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HISTORY

2012	Community conversations took place at City Church of Compton, regarding the needs of the community. After researching the statistics and witnessing the challenges surrounding education, crime, poverty and unemployment, an expanded vision seemed necessary.

Barak is the Executive Director & Co-Creator of Unearth and Empower Communities. He and his partner Sara create pathways to college, employment and entrepreneurship for Compton youth through engagement with STEM education and the arts. Barak, a revolutionary educator who disrupts broken educational systems, was handpicked to be the founding principal of a charter school in Oakland, CA (first high school built in over 40 years). Bomani and his team of educators created a school culture where 100% of senior graduates, African American and Latino students, earned at least one acceptance letter to a four-year college. A huge advocate of social emotional learning and what he calls heart, mind & soul work, Bomani curates safe and healthy spaces for communities to heal from trauma and to re-imagine a culture of living free in a diverse world. Bomani is a 3-time business owner, community activist, artist, published author & songwriter, cook, worship leader and lover of tennis. Barak earned his Bachelor of Arts in English from Dartmouth College and his Master of Arts in Educational Leadership & Supervision from San Jose State University, where he graduated with highest honors. He is married and has two sons.

This UEC vision started in 2008 when she first volunteered to teach art in her friend's classroom in the Compton Unified School District. 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
